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Past to Present

- **Some past frequent-findings may go away, some may not**
 - **Service issues**
 - **Program issues**
- **May go away**
 - **PGY2 – prior PGY1**
 - **Individualized goals and objectives**



Service Findings

- **Facilities**
- **Safe, effective drug distribution service**
- **Patient care services (provision of; appropriate depth)**
- **Use of automated systems**
- **Computerized systems**
- **Involvement in drug policy**



Program Findings – PGY2

- Preceptor development
- Documentation of customized plan
- Resident self-evaluations
- Preceptor evaluations of residents
- Overall design of the program not yet completed to meet requirements of new PGY2 standard



Critical Success Factors

- **Residency Program Essential Elements**
 - Preceptorship
 - Residency program design
 - Residency program leadership
- **Pharmacy Service Essential Elements**
 - Practice model
 - Safe, effective drug distribution systems
 - Drug use policy services
 - Pharmacy department leadership



Overview of the Accreditation Standards

- **Pharmacy Practice became PGY1**
- **Specialized became PGY2**
- **Standards must have been implemented by July 1, 2007 residency classes**
- **Standards organized using format with seven principles**



New Standards: Overview of changes

- **Supplemental standards for specialized programs have been sunset**
- **Lists of educational goals and objectives for each PGY2 area have been revised; some still in approval process**
- **New areas: informatics, cardiology, emergency medicine (?)**



Principle I

- **All resident candidates will participate in the RMP**
- **Licensure clarified**
- **PGY2: residents MUST have completed accredited PGY1 program**



Principle II

- **12 month program clarified**
- **RMP required**
- **ACGME duty hours**
- **Acceptance letter**
- **Policies on leave and licensure**
- **Adequate support required**



Principle III

- **Residents are committed to completing the program and the educational goals and objectives**
- **Considers program requirements and outside-of-program activities (moonlighting, etc)**



Principle IV

- **Four major sections outlined**
 - Program design
 - Program delivery
 - Program evaluation and improvement
 - Tracking of graduates
- **Required outcomes and supporting educational G/O**



Principle IV

- **Program delivery**
 - Orientation
 - Customization
 - Ongoing feedback
 - Tracking residency progress
- **Program evaluation and improvement**
 - Preceptor staff development
 - Annual program changes
- **Tracking program graduates**



Principle V

- **Requirements of the RPD outlined**
 - **Training and practice**
 - **Board certification**
- **Requirements of preceptors**
 - **Training and practice**
- **Contributions to the profession**



Principle VI

- **Requirements for sites and sponsoring organizations outlined**
 - RPD
 - Contractual arrangements
- **External appraisal**

Principle VII

- **Pharmacy services requirements outlined**
 - **ASHP Best Practices and other nationally applied standards, guidelines**
 - **New elements: emergency medications, outpatient drug distribution service, plan for resource utilization**
- **PGY2-specific requirements outlined**
